Following in the footsteps of St. Dominic, St. Edward and St. Gaspar, students at St. Edward School strive to be active Christians who demonstrate a spirit of service. All of us by our Baptism are called to spread the Gospel message of Jesus Christ, who reached out to the poor, the vulnerable, and those in need. Such a spirit of giving is integral to being a follower of Jesus. This is the spirit and call of Mother Pia, the foundress of the Dominican Sisters of Mission San Jose, Saint Edward, our parish patron saint and Saint Gaspar, founder of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood who serve our parish.

This year our school theme **“One Body, Many Parts”** reflects we are one in mind and heart in our service, in our living of the Gospel and in our love for one another. Our unity, service and living the Gospel message of Jesus flows from the love God generously gives us daily. This is the call we share together with in our school community. In this spirit, students are required to give a certain number of outreach hours of service.

At St. Edward Parish School our mission is to, “empower students to reach their full potential and to embrace the commitment to serve others.” Because we believe service is integral to Christian living we strive to help students become active Christians who “demonstrate a spirit of service”, socially responsible members of the community who “integrate Catholic Social Principles into their lives”, and reflective individuals who “value themselves and others.”

Students are encouraged to participate in a variety of outreach; therefore all students must be involved in a different activity at a different location each trimester. Outreach hours must be done for people or organizations outside your family and St. Edward School community. The students, along with the help of their parents, are responsible for making arrangements for

outreach opportunities. All outreach projects must be approved by the homeroom teacher before the student does the service to ensure that they meet the criteria. The students are to complete a “Report of Outreach” signed by an adult at the service site. The report is to be given to the student’s homeroom teacher. The outreach component counts as 10% of the religion grade each trimester.

All hours must be completed each trimester. Any remaining hours will carry over to the next trimester’s requirements and a letter from the principal will be sent to the family. All outreach hours for grades K-8 must be completed and the reports given to the homeroom teacher two weeks prior to the end of each trimester. *If there are any outstanding hours at the end of the school year, the student will be required to complete them over the summer or the remaining hours will be carried over to the following school year.*

Attached is a list of possible suggestions for outreach opportunities based on the Seven Catholic Social Principles. Students and their families are invited to pursue additional opportunities for service and some families have joined together to participate in service activities together.

It is our hope that by their participation in the St. Edward Student Outreach Program our students will integrate Catholic Christian service into their lives.
